SAD CASE OF JAMES A. WIGGS WHO MET DEATH IN SACRAMENTO RIVER

Last April James A. Wiggs and Will Espolt, of East Whittier, started from here on their wheels for the Sacramento Country. Last Wednesday the body of the former was sent home for burial having been found floating in the Sacramento River, Monday, September 2nd.

The circumstances surrounding the sad event remain a profound mystery, and needless to say, the lad's mother, Mrs. Robert Bush, of East Whittier, is almost prostrated with grief.....

Since leaving Whittier, the decedent, who was a boy of industrious tendencies, had been working in company with Mr. Espolt in a saw mill 100 miles above Sacramento. Tuesday he received his pay and left for Sacramento hoping to secure more lucrative employment. Nothing was heard from him until his body was found by a rancher in the Sacramento River seven miles below Sacramento two days later. About the same time a fisherman found his clothing on the opposite bank four miles further up stream.

It is the supposition that he stayed in Sacramento the first night, and when hunting for employment the next day, decided to take a swim, and met with some accident. The suspecion of foul play is dissipated by the fact that checks amounting to \$100 and other valuables in his clothing were left untouched. Coroner W. F. Gormley, of Sacramento, is of the opinion that his death was accidental. Will Espolt left the mill August 27th and did not hear of his friend's misfortune until arriving home.

The body was sent to White's undertaking parlors, where the sorrowing relatives gather Wednesday afternoon and proceeded to the cemetery. Rev. W. A. Betts conducted an impressive cememony at the grave.

Decedent was 18 years of age and a graduate of the Trenton high school and Denver business college. He moved to Whittier about a year ago with his step-father, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bush. He was a boy of much promise, and was fortunate in making friends wherever he went. -- Whittier (California) Register. p.1, c.3

Obituary of William A. Wiggs in the Trenton Register:

William A. Wigg [sic] of this city, died on Friday, April 18th 1894,

age 42 years, 6 month [sic] and 5 days.

The deceased was born in Williamson county Illinois, on October 8th 1894 [sic]. At the age of 17 he left Illinois and went to Kansas where he stayed two years and then went to Texas. He brought a herd of cattle from there to Wyoming. Soon after he arrived in Wyoming, he became foreman of a freighting outfit at Ft. Laramie for delivering provisions etc. to the government stations for the Indians. He quit freighting and with a partner went to Colorado and tried mining for about a year. Finding mining a poor business--as he lost about \$6,000, at it--he returned to Wyoming and became foreman of a cattle ranch in which he obtained a small interest. He continued in the business until 1881, when he returned to his old home in Illinois. On October 25th 1881, he married Miss Theresa Stewart, and shortly after moved to a farm he had purchased near Superior, Nebraska. They moved from there to their farm near Trenton in 1888. About a year ago the deceased was stricken with something like epilepsy, after which he became insane. He has been growing gradually worse until death finally ended his suffering. He leaves a wife and five children to mourn the loss of a loving and and [sic] faithful husband and indulgent father. He was a worthy member of the A. O. U. W. and the A. F. and A. M. and was held in high esteem by his brethren. The remains was [sic] followed to the Trenton Cemetery on Sunday at 10 o'clock by a large procession of sympathizing friends and were buried according to the rites of the Ancient Order of United Workmen, assisted by the Masons. W. A. Wiggs had no enemies but every one who knew him was his friend.

His father was a first lieutenant in the 60th Illinois regiment and he died at Cornith [sic] Mississippi 1863. His mother died in June 1857.
