Another old Settler Gone.--Old familiar faces are paling beneath the stroke of the Destroyer, and the now fruitful soil of Wisconsin is closing over the forms of those who trod upon it when it was covered by an unbroken forest.--The men who laid the foundations and hewed the solid timbers of this now great and prosperous state, having done their work well, are gathering their robes about them, and taking their canoes for the spirit land. The last will soon be gone. We have this week to record the death of DOMINICK BRUNETTE, Sen., at Duck Creek (5 miles from this city), on Sunday, Dec., 19th. Mr. B. was 83 years old. He came to Green Bay, from Montreal, in 1798, at the age of 19 years, and has resided here ever since--64 years. He was for many years an Indian trader, but of late a farmer; and has always been a sober and industrious man.
